Former Pierce County Leader publisher dies

Donald "Don" Zimmer, former Pierce County Leader publisher died June 23, 2019, at Heritage of Bel Air Nursing Home in Norfolk at the age of 95.

Memorial services for Zimmer were held June 27 at Zion Lutheran Church in Pierce. Inurnment at Prospect View Cemetery, rural Pierce. Military rites were conducted by the Pierce Tomek-Otto Post 72 American Legion, American Legion Riders, and the United States Army Honors Guard.

Zimmer began working at the Leader when he was still in high school. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II and then returned to Pierce and his job at the Leader. Zimmer, and his cousin Bob Zimmer worked together at the Leader for 41 years, at first under publishers Edgar and Alice Cox, and then publishers Bill and Norinda "Kreg" Cox. The Zimmers became publishers and editors in 1972 following the death of Bill Cox. They sold the paper to Les and Randee Falter in 1985, and Don Zimmer retired at that time. Bob Zimmer continued to work at the Leader until 1993.

Don Zimmer spent his retirement years in Pierce, continuing to support the community he cared for.

He is survived by his wife of 72 years, Millie of Norfolk; son Gary (Mary) Zimmer of Pierce; daughter Sheryl (Paul) Buss of Pierce and their families. Condolences may be expressed to the family online at www.stonacekfuneralchapel.com.

University of Nebraska students begin flood serviceship projects

By Melissa Lee, Director of Communications, University of Nebraska, June 27, 2019 From documenting damage to roads and bridges to organizing a thank-you event for volunteers who cleaned

up local fairgrounds, from developing multi-lingual disaster recovery materials to assisting with landscape design and GPS mapping, University of Nebraska students have begun



working in communities across the state through a new summer serviceship program created in the wake of this year's devastating flooding.

Twenty-four NU students, representing the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, University of Nebraska at Kearney and University of Nebraska at Omaha, are beginning serviceships in 14 communities, with more students being placed on an ongoing basis as the university matches students' skills with local needs.

An additional group of eight students from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's College of Journalism and Mass Communications is traveling across the state to share stories of the flooding's impact and document recovery efforts.

"Our commitment to Nebraskans from the beginning has been that the University of Nebraska will be a partner for as long as it takes for our state to rebuild," said Chuck Hibberd, dean and director of Nebraska Extension, which is coordinating the NU system's flood response efforts together with a university-wide team of experts. "Our students have a wealth of knowledge and an eagerness to serve. The flood serviceship program is a perfect opportunity for them to gain real-world experience in meeting the needs of our communities.

"We're proud of our students for stepping up, and we're excited to have projects underway that will help Nebraska on the long road to recovery."





Former Creighton University journalism professor, Omaha World-Herald reporter receives national recognition

Natl. Federation of Press Women Release, June 28, 2019 Eileen Wirth of Omaha has received the 2019 Communicator

of Achievement Award from the National Federation of Press Women (NFPW). This prestigious award has been given for 62 years.

Wirth received the award during the organization's annual conference, held this year in Baton Rouge, La. Now



The Communicator of Achievement award is the highest honor bestowed by NFPW upon those members who have distinguished themselves within and beyond their field. The recipient, chosen from nominees selected by state affiliates from around the country, is recognized for exceptional achievement in the communications field, as well as service to NFPW and to the community.

Wirth, a member of the Nebraska Press Women, is a retired professor of journalism and mass communication at Creighton University. She became the first woman chair of Creighton's journalism department in 1998. During her tenure, Wirth enlarged the department, bringing graphic design and computer science together with journalism, advertising, public relations, photography, video and new media.

Before joining the university, Wirth was one of the first female news reporters at the Omaha World-Herald, then became the first woman in public relations management at the Union Pacific Railroad. Wirth said she didn't set out to break barriers in her career. All she wanted at the beginning was to be a hard news reporter for the state's largest newspaper. Wirth also co-authored eight books and scores of articles. Most prominent among her books is *From Society Page to Front Page: Nebraska Women in Journalism*, published in 2013.

In addition to professional achievement, the Communicator of Achievement Award recognizes service to the community and to the National Federation of Press Women. Wirth was a staunch, early supporter of the Nebraska Women Journalists Hall of Fame and continues to write and advocate for strong, independent journalism.

She now volunteers as a trustee for the Nebraska State Historical Society, helping rebrand the group as History Nebraska. Wirth served Nebraska Press Women in various capacities and won multiple awards in the NFPW Communications Contest as a World-Herald reporter.

Runner-up in the Communicator of Achievement competition was Verna Gates of Birmingham, Ala., an active member of Alabama Professional Communicators. A longtime journalist who was one of the original 50 employees of CNN, Gates is also a nationally known folklorist and travel writer.
