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Longtime newspaperman, Terry Anderson, retiring after 45 years



Terry Anderson is retiring after 45 years in the newspaper industry, almost all in Nebraska newsrooms. The Osceola, Neb., native's first byline was actually in 1971, writing high school sports stories for his hometown Osceola Record.

His first full-time job came in June 1974 as a 19-year-old reporter for the Columbus

Telegram. He held several titles during his four years there, the last nearly two years as sports editor.

That was followed by two years at the Lincoln Journal Star while he finished he bachelor's degree at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Meantime, his publisher in Columbus was transferred to Odessa, Texas, and hired him as a sports writer for the Odessa American.

Just over 10 months later, he was back in Nebraska for 20 years at the Omaha World-Herald, in the sports department, regional news desk, night and day copy desks and a general assignment reporter.

His final stop, lasting more than 16 years, was at Plaindealer Publishing in Tekamah, where he has served as news editor of its agriculture publications, including Midwest Producer and Midwest Messenger.

He and his wife Nalini will continue to live in Omaha, near their two children and three grandchildren.

Madison Keith, Seward Co. Independent, Aug. 7, 2019 Three new staff have recently joined The Seward Co. Independent.



The University of Nebraska-Lincoln College of Journalism and Mass Communications will host a Google Tools



training on Friday, Aug. 30, from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. in the Nebraska Union Auditorium. The training is free and open to the public. Registration is required. Feel free to attend any part or all of the training. People will be coming and going all day.

To improve research, news gathering, reporting, storytelling, market analysis and creative projects, the training will cover how to use a variety of Google tools, including:

- Google Trends
- Google Scholar
- Google My Maps
- Google Flourish Studio
- Google Earth Pro
- Google Earth Engine
- Google Earth Studio

Anyone can attend and no need to sign up. And please feel free to spread the word to any area universities, newsrooms, etc.

Attendees should bring a laptop and do the following prior to the session:

The training will be led by Mike Reilly, a CoJMC alum and digital trainer for the Society of Professional Journalists.

Reilly has taught Google News Initiative tools to more than 4,000 journalists and educators in the past 2.5 years. When he's not on the road doing trainings, he teaches data and multimedia journalism at the University of Illinois-Chicago, where he is a visiting professor.

A former reporter at the LA Times and web editor at the Chicago Tribune, Mike served for 13 years as a faculty member at Northwestern, Arizona State University and DePaul University, teaching digital journalism to hundreds of students and professional journalists.He holds journalism degrees from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (undergrad) and Northwestern University (masters).


