Longtime Keith Co. News owners, Bev and Jack Pollock, receive Daily Nebraskan Hall of Fame Legacy Award

Former Ogallala Keith County News owners and publishers, Beverly Pollock of Ogallala, and the late Jack Pollock were named the inaugural winners of the Daily Nebraskan Hall of Fame Legacy Award.

Todd von Kampen of North Platte, who nominated the Pollocks for the award, accepted it on their behalf during the UNL student newspaper's alumni banquet on August 30, 2019.

Jack Pollock, who died in 2009, met his wife Bev at the Daily Nebraskan when he was DN editor and she was editor of The Cornhusker yearbook.

Jack served as president of NPA in 1976, received the Master Editor-Publisher Award, NPA's highest honor, in 1993, and was inducted into the Nebraska Journalism Hall of Fame in 2000.

Bev Pollock received national recognition, one of just two Nebraska journalists to receive the Emma C. McKinney Award for her contributions to weekly journalism, and was inducted into the Marian Andersen Nebraska Women Journalists Hall of Fame in 2011.

Statement of Ownership filings due Oct. 1

Oct. 1 is the deadline for paid distribution newspapers to file the Statement of Ownership, Management and Circulation form (PS Form 3526) with your postmaster.

Remember that paid electronic subscriptions may be included as circulation in postal statements. A paid subscriber, electronic or print, may only be counted once. A print subscriber with free access to the electronic version of your paper cannot be counted as a paid e-subscriber. To be considered a paid electronic subscriber, the subscriber must pay more than a nominal rate for the subscription.

After filing, you must publish your statement according to the following timetable, depending on frequency of publication:

• Publications issued more frequently than weekly should publish <u>no later than Oct. 10</u>. This applies to dailies, semi-weeklies and three-times-per-week publications.

• Publications issued weekly, or less frequently, but not less than monthly, <u>publish by Oct. 31</u>. This applies to weeklies.

Former Columbus Telegram reporter, broadcaster, Ron Bogus dies



Ron Bogus, 84, died August 9, 2019, at his home in Columbus, NE.

Funeral services were held August 13 at St. Isidore Catholic Church in Columbus, with interment in the St. Patrick-Joseph Cemetery in Platte Center.

Bogus was born and raised in Platte

Center and attended Norfolk Junior College (Northeast Community College) and is a member of that school's Hall of Success.

In the mid-1950's, he accepted a position with the Columbus Telegram as a reporter and photographer until 1965, when he became news director for Columbus' first commercial radio station KTTT. While in the news business, Bogus was privileged to be able to interview John F. Kennedy and Robert Kennedy during their campaign visits to Columbus. In 1968, he was awarded by the Associated Press as Nebraska's top print and broadcast news contributor. In 1970, he accepted a position with Nebraska Public Power District and retired in 1996 after 26 years with NPPD as Manager of Public Affairs. After retiring from NPPD, Bogus held positions with Leslie Associates, an Omaha public relations firm, and the Midlands Business Journal.

Bogus was always active in the community, serving 16 years on the Columbus Board of Parks and Recreational Commission, three terms on the Columbus City Council, and involvement in many other local organizations and associations.

He is survived by his wife of 63 years, Bonnie; son, Randy of Omaha; daughter, Deb (Paul) Schlickbernd of West Point; daughter, Tami (Larry) Buntgen of Eden Prairie, MN; and son, Rick (Dawn) Bogus of Columbus; and their families.

Participants will explore




obstacles women have encountered in newsrooms in the past and continue to face today, hear from a local Fremont author who has strong ties to the community, and participate in a panel discussion on the media's response to this year's historic flooding in the state.

Keynote speaker Kristin Gilger, senior associate dean at the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Mass Communication at Arizona State University, returns to Nebraska to talk about her new book, *"There's No Crying in Newsrooms: What Women Have Learned About What It Takes to Lead."* She is a graduate of the journalism programs at the University of Nebraska-Omaha, where she got her bachelor's degree, and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, where she received her master's.

The noon luncheon will honor NPW's 2019 Communicator of Achievement (COA). Luncheon speaker Sue Reyzlik, whose family has long-time ties to Fremont, will share her sense of community pride with her presentation, "This is My Town."

An afternoon panel will explore the media and communities' response to historic 2019 spring flooding. Panelists will share their experiences and reflect on the importance of the media during disasters such as this one. Panelists are: Erin Grace, a metro columnist at the Omaha World-Herald, where she has worked for 21 years; Rose Ann Shannon recently retired as the news director of KETV in Omaha, a position she held for nearly 25 years; Tammy Real-McKeighan is news editor of the Fremont Tribune, where she has worked for almost 38 years.


